





## What is Tyrewise?

- Tyrewise is the accredited, regulated product stewardship scheme for end-of-life tyres in Aotearoa New Zealand.
- Designed by industry, supported by Government, Tyrewise is replacing current disposal charges with a new stewardship fee ending tyre waste to support research and innovation to recycle or repurpose 90% of end-of-life tyres.

## What tyres are covered by Tyrewise?

- All pneumatic (Air filled) and solid tyres for use on motorised vehicles, including cars, trucks, buses, motorcycles, aircraft, trailers and off-road vehicles.
- Most agricultural machinery are also included.

## How does the Tyrewise scheme affect me?

- From 1 March 2024 the tyre stewardship fee is paid when purchasing new tyres.
- Charges vary based on the size and function of the tyre and assigned an average Equivalent Passenger Unit (EPU) value. The fees are modelled on \$6.65 excl GST per EPU.
- This fee must be passed on to consumers.
- TWL must ensure the fee is transparently declared at each point in the tyre sales process.
- The fee is identified as Tyre Stewardship Fee on the TWL invoice to the consumer.
